**COBB GETTING CLOSE**—RH Alex Cobb will make a rehab start on Saturday for Class-A Charlotte vs. Clearwater (Phillies) at the Charlotte Sports Park...he is expected to throw 5 innings or 75 pitches...Cobb has been on the DL since April 13 with a left oblique strain...the Rays were 7-5 until he was put on the DL; since then they are 11-18.

**BEN ZOBRIST**—Has been placed on the 15-day DL due to a dislocated left thumb, sustained yesterday in Seattle on headfirst slide in a stolen base attempt...the thumb was put back in place at the stadium...he will remain with the team on the road trip and be reevaluated when the team returns home.

**WELCOME FIGGY**—INF Cole Figueroa, 26, has been selected from Triple-A Durham and will wear No. 35...his first major league call-up means that all four players acquired from the Padres in exchange for SS Jason Bartlett on Dec 17, 2010 have played in the majors for the Rays: also LH Cesar Ramos, RH Brandon Gomes and RH Adam Russell...this season, in his third year at Durham, he was hitting .299/.397/.462 (35-for-117).

- + Has 320 BB and 240 SO in his minor league career...recognized by team last year as having Best Strike-Zone Discipline in the Rays org.
- + Figueroa played two seasons (2007-08) for the University of Florida and becomes third Gator to play for the Rays, joining RH Dave Eiland (1998-2000 with Rays) and 3B Herbert Perry (1999-2000).

**FLEX PACKS HIT 20K**—The Rays have now sold over 20,000 Flex Packs...visit [raysbaseball.com/flexpack](http://raysbaseball.com/flexpack) to save on a 3-, 6- or 9-game package.

**RAY MATTER**—The Rays arrive in Anaheim for a 4-game series having won three straight road series and 6 of their last 8 road games...they won 2 of 3 this week in Seattle, following series wins at Boston and New York on the previous road trip...after gaining a game yesterday, the last-place Rays are only 3.5 GB of first-place Baltimore in the AL East—only the third time since divisional realignment (1994) that the AL East has been separated by so few games on this date or later: also June 7, 2012 (3.0) and May 25, 2011 (3.5)...the Rays have spent the past 9 days in last place—only the second time since the becoming the Rays in 2008 that they've been in last after the season's opening month (also June 22-23, 2013...33 days later, they were in 1st place after a 22-5 run).

- + The Rays are 7-2 in one-run games, best in the majors...they've won 12 of their last 14 dating back to 2013.
- + The Rays are 14-4 this season when their starting pitcher goes at least 6 innings, and 4-19 when he doesn't.
- + Eight of the Rays 9 runs scored in Seattle, including both yesterday, came with 2 outs...the Rays drew 3 consecutive 2-out walks in the 4th, the last two after being behind 0-2 in the count.

**RAYS vs. HALOS**—The Rays are 15-4 in their last 19 games at Angel Stadium, dating back to May 11, 2010...in 41 games preceding this stretch the Rays went 5-36 in Anaheim (April 29, 2000—May 10, 2010)...over their last 20 meetings dating back to June 6, 2011, Rays pitchers have recorded a 2.63 ERA (178-IP, 52-ER) vs. the Angels and have held them to 3 runs or less in 16 of 20 games...since leaving the Angels to become Rays manager, Joe Maddon owns a 33-33 record: 4-13 in his first two years (2006-07) and 29-20 since then...the Rays trail the all-time series, 83-61.

**17.0**—Consecutive scoreless innings thrown by the Rays pitching staff, entering tonight (6-H, 3-BB, 20-SO)...the last run was an RBI groundout by SEA Robinson Cano on Tuesday, in the 1st inning off LH David Price...the club record is 27.0 (Sep 12-15, 2013).

**LOW-SCORING AFFAIRS**—The Rays won the last 2 games in Seattle by scores of 2-0 (Tuesday) and 2-1 (yesterday)...this is only the fourth time in club history—and second this season—the Rays have won back-to-back games scoring 2 runs or less in each game (also April 11-12 at CIN, won 2-1 and 1-0)...Elias points out that the Rays have 6 wins this season when scoring no more than 2 runs, tied with the Braves for most in the majors.

- + Yesterday was the Rays fourth shutout of the season, all coming on the road...the 4 road shutouts are tied with the Blue Jays, Cardinals and Braves for most in the majors.
- + Yesterday featured a combined 5 hits by the Rays (3) and Mariners (2)—tied for 3rd fewest ever in a Rays game...last time a Rays game had so few hits was Oct 2, 2012 vs. BAL (4 hits, 2 each) in a 1-0 loss.
- + Last time the Rays staff allowed 2 hits or fewer in a game was July 27, 2013 at NYY in a 2-hit shutout by RH Chris Archer.

**REFRESHED BULLPEN**—In Seattle the Rays bullpen worked only 4.1 innings, and only four of the seven relievers were used...RHs Juan Carlos Oviedo, Brandon Gomes and Brad Boxberger did not pitch...it was the first time Rays starters worked at least 6 IP in each game of a series since April 4-6 vs. TEX, before Alex Cobb was placed on the DL on April 13...the Rays entered this road trip leading the majors in relief innings and now rank 3rd at 140.1, behind the Dodgers (144.2) and White Sox (141)...this is 33 IP more than a year ago through 41 games (107.1, 3rd fewest in majors).

**GOOSE EGGS**—Yesterday starter RH Jake Odorizzi allowed only one hit, a 2-out single by James Jones in the 6th...it ended the longest no-hit bid by a Rays starter since LH Matt Moore on July 11, 2013 vs. MIN (5.2 IP)...had retired 12 in a row prior to that...it was the 14th time since 2012 a Rays starter has allowed 1 hit or less, most in the majors.

- + His 6 IP marked his longest start since April 4 vs. TOR, snapping a club-record streak of 5 IP or less in 6 straight starts.

**ZERO HERO**—C Ryan Hanigan has started 3 of the Rays 4 shutouts this season...over the last 2 seasons he has handled 13 shutouts in only 92 starts...he has caught 14 shutouts in his last 96 starts dating back to CIN Homer Bailey's no-hitter on Sep 28, 2012 at PIT...the leaders since then:

**RBI MACHINE**—C Ryan Hanigan is tied with 1B James Loney for the team lead in RBI (22)...he is more than halfway to his career high (40 in 2010) and is on pace for 87, which would be a record for a Rays catcher (77, John Flaherty in 1999)...ranks 3rd among major league catchers, trailing MIN Kurt Suzuki (25) and ARI Miguel Montero (24)...he has 15 RBI with 2 outs, tops among major league catchers and tied for 3rd overall in the AL.

**NOWHERE TO PUT THEM**—SS Yunel Escobar broke the scoreless tie in the 4th inning yesterday with a bases-loaded walk...since Derek Shelton became hitting coach prior to the 2010 season the Rays have drawn 61 bases-loaded walks, most in the majors over that span.

**IN HIS OWN BACKYARD**—Downey, Calif., native 3B Evan Longoria is a career .377/.448/.727 (29-for-77) hitter at Angel Stadium with 6 HR, 17 RBI and 9 2B in 21 games here...his .377 avg. here is 3rd highest among visiting active players (min. 50 AB) behind OAK John Jaso (.389) and TOR Melky Cabrera (.380) and is Evan's personal highest mark in any AL park.

- + Longoria is the Rays all-time HR leader with 166...passed Carlos Peña (163) on April 18 vs. NYY...is the only franchise leader in baseball currently with that team...is closing in on club records in RBI (28 shy of Crawford's 592) and doubles (8 shy of Crawford's 215).

**DAVID DEJESUS**—Since April 22, when he snapped a career-long 0-for-24 stretch, is batting .377/.465/.672 (23-for-71) in 20 games...during this stretch ranks 2nd in the AL in avg. and OBP behind OAK Derek Norris and ranks 3rd in SLG and OPS (1.137) behind Norris and BOS David Ortiz...he's raised his season avg. from .119 to .272 and his OBP from .196 to .359.

**YOUR PATIENCE IS APPRECIATED**—Of the Rays 41 games this season, 31 have been at least 3 hours, 15 at least 3-1/2 hours and 5 at least 4 hours...15 of their last 16 games have gone 3 hours-plus.

**7 DAYS OF PEACE & BASEBALL**—For the first two flights on this trip (Tampa-Seattle, Seattle-LA) the Rays traveling party dressed to a "Woodstock" theme...this was the team's 30th themed road trip since Manager Joe Maddon hatched the idea in 2008...it's the second themed trip this season—the "Hat Trip 2.0" was held for their trip to Chicago on April 24.

- + LAST START**—On Sat vs. CLE, picked up his second win over the season in the Rays only win of their 6-game homestand (1-5)...only allowed one hit, a 1-out double by **Ryan Raburn** in the 2nd...marked his 5th start allowing 1 hit or less, 3rd of at least 6 IP, first time since throwing 6.1 hitless innings on July 20, 2013 vs. SEA...recorded 9 fly ball outs to 3 ground ball outs...his line: 6 IP, 1 H, 0 R/ER, 3 BB, 4 SO, 101 pitches, 60 strikes.
- + TURNAROUND**—Has won consecutive decisions as a starter for the first time since June 14-26, 2013, snapping a 9-game losing streak spanning 15 starts...has not won 3 straight starts since May 27–June 7, 2009...has allowed 1 run or less in 3 consecutive starts for the first time since June 20–July 4, 2008...has not allowed 1 or less in 4 straight starts since July 7-25, 2007.
  - + Is 2-0 with a 1.06 ERA (17-IP, 2-ER) in his last 3 starts compared to 0-1 with a 9.39 ERA (7.2-IP, 8-ER) in his first 2 starts.
- + NO HOMERS ALLOWED**—Has not allowed a home run since the 2nd inning on Sep 16, 2013 vs. CIN...has a current streak of 40.2 consecutive homerless innings since then, his longest streak since going 43 consecutive innings without a homer from April 20–May 31, 2011.
  - + Is the only pitcher in the AL to not allow a homer with as many innings pitched and 1 of 2 in the majors, along with ATL **David Hale** (32.2-IP)...DET **Anibal Sanchez** ranks 2nd in the AL, having not allowing a home run in 23 IP this season.
- + HOW HE GOT HERE**—Originally signed a minor league contract with the Rays on Feb 14...exercised the opt-out clause in his contract and was released March 25 after the Rays selected Jake Odorizzi for the fifth starter role on March 22...signed a minor league contract on March 28...made his Rays debut that day in relief, totaling 2 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 0 ER, 1 BB, 0 SO...worked the 5th and 6th innings in the 12-4 loss.
- + ON THE ROAD**—Will be making his 4th app/3rd start on the road this season...has a 1.38 ERA (13-IP, 2-ER) on the road, tied for 5th among AL pitchers with as many innings...on the last road trip he made starts in Boston and New York-AL, crafting a 1.64 ERA (11-IP, 2-ER).
- + RAYS NO. 7**—Became the seventh starting pitcher used by the Rays this season, matching their total from 2009 and 2010 over each full season and one shy of their total in 2011 and 2012...in 2013, the Rays used 10 different starters—their most in one season since since 2006 (12)...since 2008, however, Bedard became only the 21st starter used by the Rays, three fewer than any other club (Giants, 24)...the Orioles have used the most starters during that span with 45.
- + STILL SEARCHING**—Has never played for a postseason team.
- + SENIOR MOMENT**—Makes his start tonight at 35 years, 71 days...with the exception of 38-year-old RH **Jamey Wright**—who started on Sep 1, 2013 at OAK in a planned bullpen day—he is the oldest Rays starter since RH **Hideo Nomo** on July 15, 2005 vs. TOR (36 years, 318 days).
  - + He is the fifth-oldest pitcher to make a start in the AL this season, behind TOR **R.A. Dickey** (39), NYY **Hiroki Kuroda** (39), KC **Bruce Chen** (36) and BOS **John Lackey** (35).
  - + Has more service time (11 years, 7 days) than all but one current Ray: C **Jose Molina** (12 years, 73 days).
- + SPRING TRAINING**—Came to camp as a non-roster invite and made 5 apps (3 starts), going 2-2 with a 6.88 ERA (17-IP, 13-ER) while battling for the fifth starter role...the three pitchers who competed for that spot—RH **Jake Odorizzi**, LH **Cesar Ramos** and Bedard—are now all part of the Rays rotation...the Rays are his fifth major league team in 4 years.
- + 2013**—Was 4-12 with a 4.59 ERA in 32 apps and a team-leading 26 starts for the Astros.

**CAREER**—Is 4-5 with a 4.45 ERA (56.2-IP, 28-ER) in 10 career starts against LAA.

**LAST START**—Faced them once last year, picking up the win on June 3 at Angel Stadium, allowing 1 run on 5 hits in 7 innings.

**SINCE 2009**—Is 3-1 with a 1.75 ERA (25.2-IP, 5-ER) and 19 SO in 4 starts against the Angels.

**AT ANGEL STADIUM**—Is 2-2 with a 5.60 ERA (27.1-IP, 17-ER) in 5 career starts.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER—RH CHRIS ARCHER (2-2, 5.16)

- + LAST START**—On Sun vs. CLE, suffered his first home loss since Aug 13, 2013 vs. SEA, snapping a streak of 8 unbeaten starts at Tropicana Field...issued 4 walks, his most at home since June 12 vs. BOS...his line: 5 IP, 8 H, 4 R/ER, 4 BB, 2 SO, 1 HR, 100 pitches, 58 strikes.
- + LAST THREE**—Is 0-1 with a 7.36 ERA (14.2-IP, 12-ER) and 10 BB to 11 SO over his last his last 3 starts...has gone 5 IP or less in 3 consecutive starts for the first time in his career...in his first 5 starts was 2-1 with a 4.11 ERA (30.2-IP, 14-ER) and 5 BB to 25 SO.
- + THE LONG BALL**—On Sun vs. CLE, allowed a solo HR to **Yan Gomes** in the 6th, his last batter faced...has allowed 3 HR over his last 19.1 innings after starting the season with 27.1 consecutive homerless innings.
- + 2-STRIKE COUNTS**—Opponents are hitting .227 (22-for-97) against him in 2-strike counts, up from .152 (38-for-250) in 2013...in his last start, Indians batters went 6-for-11 with 2 BB against him in 2-strike counts...the major league average this season is .175.
- + vs. LAA**—Has made 2 career starts against the Angels, both last season, and is 1-1 with a 5.06 ERA (10.2-IP, 6-ER)...faced them in back-to-back starts, Aug 28 at Tropicana Field (W, 7-IP, 5-H, 1-ER) and Sep 2 at Angel Stadium (L, 3.2-IP, 9 H, 5-ER)...allowed 3 runs in the 4th inning, including the final 2 on a home run by Erick Aybar...was the 2nd-shortest start of his career at the time.

## #70 JOE MADDON, MANAGER

- + Ninth-year Rays manager** is the 3rd-longest tenured skipper in MLB after LAA **Mike Scioscia** (15th) and MIN **Ron Gardenhire** (13th).
- + Has managed more than half games** in Rays history (1,338 of 2,631)...owns a career 695-643 (.519) record with the Rays: 127-197 (.392) in his first two seasons (2006-07) and 568-446 (.560) since the start of 2008...the Rays were 518-775 (.401) prior to his arrival.
- + Was ejected May 2** at NYY by home plate umpire **Brian O'Nora** in the 13th inning for arguing result of instant replay review...was his second ejection this season and 34th as a Ray, a club record.
- + Two-time AL Manager of the Year** (2008, 2010)...only two other head coaches/managers among Florida's major pro teams have lasted as long: **Don Shula** (Dolphins, 26 years) and **John McKay** (Bucs, 9 years).
